Visa Application Procedure	After screening, SU will submit your documents to the Immigration Bureau to apply for your Certificate of Eligibility (CoE).  Once issued, we will forward it to you via email. Upon receiving our email, each student must apply for a "Student (Ryugaku)" visa at the Japanese Embassy or Consulate in their home country before traveling to Japan. For further details, please contact your local Japanese Embassy or Consulate.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### Q. When do I choose my courses?

A: Course lists and syllabi will be finalized by April 1 each year. Students will be guided through the course registration process shortly after arriving in Saitama. ## Q. Is there any limitation to take courses?

A: SU offers more than 70 courses conducted in English which is available to register without any restrictions. Some courses in Japanese are available for the exchange students to register as well. Further information and directions are given at the Course registration orientation after arrival.

### Q. Can I take Intensive Japanese language courses?

A: For students who wish to concentrate on Japanese language studies, SU Japanese Education Center provides comprehensive courses on the Japanese language. This course is designed for those who wish to study the Japanese language comprehensively on a continuous basis in a series of six classes: Japanese A to Japanese S, from beginner to the advanced level. Students will take the placement exam and will be placed in their appropriate levels.

#### Q. How does SU offer credits?

A: The Japanese government defines the concept of one credit in Japan is equivalent to 45 hours of workload including lectures and student learning time. Saitama University follows this regulation; 1 credit = 45 hours of workload including lecture time and learning time for students.

#### Q. When can I start living in the dormitory? Can I leave my baggage before the check-in day?

A: We will announce the date of check-in later. Unfortunately, no one is allowed to send their baggages prior to your move-in date.

## Q. I am planning to study at SU for half a year, but I might change my mind. Can I extend my study period later?

A: SU accept exchange students to extend their original study period under certain conditions. (It is a prerequisite that you have the approval of your home university).

Details will be provided after admission, but applicants will be screened based on SU's academic performance and other requirements.

## Q. Can I apply for JASSO Scholarship?

A: Saitama University's STEPS program has been qualified for the JASSO scholarship. We will select scholarship recipients from the specific universities and countries based on JASSO's selection criteria for the contribution to our university's internationalization and support our students' international learning opportunities.

#### Q. Will I have internet access?

A: Yes! Free Wi-Fi on campus and in I-House is available.
